## **New Testament Reading**

The Second Reading consists of excerpts from the writings of Saints Paul and James, and the unknown author of the letter to the Hebrews, addressing the early churches about music.

From the letter to the Romans - "Now I say that Jesus Christ has become a servant to the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made to the fathers, and that the Gentiles might glorify God for His mercy, as it is written: 'For this reason I will confess to You among the Gentiles, and sing to Your name."

From the first letter to the Corinthians "What is the conclusion then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will also pray with the understanding. I will sing with the spirit, and I will also sing with the understanding."

**From the letter to the Ephesians** "And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord..." (

From the letter to the Colossians "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him."

**From the letter to the Hebrews** "For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for which reason he is not ashamed to call them brethren, saying: 'I will declare Your name to My brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will sing praise to You."

**From the letter of St. James** "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms."

This is the word of the Lord.

Gospel *Luke 1:46-55* 

When the Gospel is announced the reader says
Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

And Mary said:

"My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me— holy is his name.

His mercy extends to those who fear him,

from generation to generation.

He has performed mighty deeds with his arm;

he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.

He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful

to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."
