The music this week is by two leading English composer/organists of the eighteenth century - George Frideric Handel (1685-1759) and John Stanley (1713-1786). Both were blind, Stanley from his youth and Handel during his later years. They were friends, both working in London, and in the forefront of developing the organ as an important part of worship, following the destruction of most instruments during the Reformation and by Oliver Cromwell during the civil war. London then suffered again with many restored instruments being destroyed during the Great Fire of 1666."
